Winners Dog and Best of Opposite Sex

Belstock's **BELBAR DOUBLE CHOCOLATE CHIP** (Ch. Brummagem Chips Ahoy ex Sinabar White Merlot) – Brindle and white thug of a dog. His head is packed with fill and he has a strong profile. His mouth is off. Nice forechest. He has very good bone

although I would prefer a bit more length of leg in the front. The tail set and rear angulation are good. Stacks very nicely, but needs work on ring training.

Reserve Winners Dog

Pew's **Silmaril Speedwaggin'** (Ch Boromir Quicksilver ex Ch Silmaril Scarlet Temptress) – A young dog with a good head with good fill and a gently curved profile, but not as powerful a head as the winner. He has a good ear set and utilizes his ears well to enhance his expression. The mouth is correct. He has nice reach of neck. Although upright in front, he has a good topline, good rear angulation and a good tail set. This boy just needs time to mature.

Winners Bitch and Best of Winners

Davis's **BULLYVIEW COMANCHE GIRL** (Ch. Bullbrit Little Big Horn at Bullyview ex Ch. Kearby's Bathsheba at Bullyview) – A lovely black brindle girl with a head that has good length of skull and a gently curved profile. Good ear set. Her mouth is correct. She has good reach of neck and a nice forechest. She has sufficient bone for her size. She is fairly square with good front construction, good rear angulation and a good tail set. Good movement. Pushed the BOV for final placement.

Reserve Winners Bitch

Pulju, Devers and Perrott's **APPRENTICE'S PRETTY WOMAN** (Old Forge Modern Dash Riprock ex Ch. Apprentice's Sittin Pretty) – A young bitch with lovely length of skull and gently curved profile. Her ear set could be tidier. The mouth is correct. She is finer boned than the winner. Slightly upright shoulder causes dip in the topline, but she has good rear angulation and a good tail set. She needs time to mature.

Best of Variety

Pew's **Ch. SILMARIL STELLA LUNA** (Ch. Rocky Top's Sundance Kid ex Silmaril Serenade) – Elegant bitch with a good head that has a gently curved profile, good length of skull and good fill. The mouth is correct. She has good reach of neck. She has a good forechest and a straight front. Her rear construction is not her forte.

WHITE (1-2-3-2) 2 absentees

Winners Dog and Best of Winners

Avery's **TREDECIM TLAQUEPAQUE** (Allegro Rocky Mtn Thunder ex Ch. Tredecim Bewitching Grace) – Substantial dog whose head has good fill. The profile could be stronger and I would like a little more strength of muzzle. His front is straight with very good bone. His structure is just off square.

Winners Bitch

Denman and Lerner's **BULLYSTAR INTERSTELLAR OVERDRIVE OF LAROC** (Ch. Borsolino Blackhawk ex Ch. Laroc's Ain't No Stoppin Her) – Elegant bitch with nice reach of neck. She has nice length of skull but her profile could be a bit stronger and she could use a bit more fill. The mouth is correct. She has adequate bone for her size. Nice rear angulation.

Reserve Winners Bitch

Belstock's **BELBAR WHITE MERLOT** (Ch. Belbar's High Five ex Sinabar A Current Affair) – A chunky bitch that could use more length of leg. She is somewhat long cast. She has very good bone. Correct mouth

Best of Variety

Belstock's **Ch. MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM** (Ch. Brummagem Chips Ahoy ex Sinabar White Merlot) – This is a chunk of a dog. He has a very good head that is packed with fill and has a good profile. His tiny eye and good ear set give him very good expression. The mouth is correct. He has good bone. He slightly long cast. He has good rear angulation.

Best of Opposite Sex

Deever's and Perrott's **Ch. APPRENTICE'S SHOOTIN FOR ACTION** (Ch. Action Big Shot ex Ch. Apprentice's Cheatin Heart) – This bitch has a head with a gently curved profile. I would like to see a bit more fill and a tidier ear set. Good forechest with a straight front and good bone for her size. Nice rear angulation.
